Miami-Dade County Emergency Order 27-20

[Miami-Dade County Emergency Order 27-20](#) establishes a **countywide curfew starting Friday, July 3, 2020 throughout Miami-Dade County from 10 p.m. each night until 6 a.m.** the next morning. Essential workers, among them first responders, hospital workers, food delivery services, media and utility repair service personnel, will be exempted from the curfew. Moreover, persons walking their dogs within 250 feet from their residence are also exempt from the curfew.

Miami-Dade County Emergency Order 26-20

Beginning Friday, July 3, 2020 at 12:01 a.m., [Miami-Dade County Emergency Order 26-20](#) orders movie theaters, concert houses, auditoriums, playhouses, bowling alleys, arcades, indoor amusement facilities, and casinos (except casinos on sovereign tribal land) closed in Miami-Dade County.

Miami-Dade County Order Relative to Face Coverings

Miami-Dade County Mayor issued [Amendment 1 to Emergency Order 2020](#) effective July 2, 2020 at 9:00 a.m., which **requires that all persons throughout Miami-Dade County wear a mask or other facial covering at all times when in public or public spaces, including common areas in residential and commercial buildings.**

Masks and other facial coverings shall not be required:

- (1) inside a person's private residence or home;
- (2) inside a private automobile;
- (3) at or inside any religious institution, without limitation;
- (4) inside a hotel, motel, or commercial lodging establishment guest room, or inside any apartment/condominium unit;
- (5) for children under the age of two years;
- (6) of persons who cannot wear a mask or facial covering due to an existing medical condition;
- (7) of an individual who is hearing impaired or an individual who is communicating with an individual who is hearing impaired;
- (8) where federal or state safety or health regulations prohibit the wearing of facial coverings;
- (9) of persons actively engaged in strenuous physical activity, either inside or outdoors;
- (10) of persons swimming or engaged in other activities which may cause the facial covering to become wet;
- (11) while persons are actively eating, drinking, or smoking; and,
- (12) while a person is receiving services, which require access to that person's nose or mouth.
