Summary of Activities and Events

Code Enforcement

Code Enforcement Officers (CEOs) assisted the Building Department and Parks & Public Spaces Department by responding to complaints of dirty pools at construction sites in the gated community. CEOs inspected a construction site on the 100 Block of Camden Drive and issued the homeowner a warning for dirty, standing water. CEOs then inspected the pool at a construction site on the 200 Block of Bal Bay Drive and discovered a similar situation. They issued the property owner a code violation warning for dirty, standing water. Each site was instructed to drain or teat the pools. CEOs will return to each site to ensure compliance with Village Codes.

CEOs patrolling, the area of Bal Cross Drive discovered jet skis on a trailer within public view. CEOs issued the home owner a code violation warning directing them to remove the jet skis from sight.

Criminal Investigations

The Criminal Investigations Division (CID) continues to work with local retailers in an effort to improve prosecution of retail theft suspects. Using "The Exchange" newsletter, flyers circulated to participating retailers stressing the importance of providing proper video evidence in a timely manner. Retailers were informed about the video needed for prosecution and the methods of delivery to the police department.

Detectives investigated two retail theft cases occurring at the same retailer in the Bal Harbour Shops. Video footage provided images of the suspects involved in each theft. Detectives used the images to prepare need-to-identify flyers for distribution to neighboring jurisdictions. COVID-19 masking mandates have hampered retail theft investigations by providing a means by which a suspect can conceal their identity. Regardless of this hurdle, detectives continue to investigate the cases and make all possible efforts to identify the suspects involved.

11-21-2020 Theft 9700 Collins Avenue

Zimmerman store associates discovered missing merchandise while conducting an audit. A review of the in-store surveillance footage revealed a male selected a piece of merchandise from the shelf and conceal it under his shirt. The male then exited the store without paying. This case has been forwarded to the Criminal Investigations Division for follow-up.

11-21-2020 Criminal Mischief (Graffiti) North Parking Lot

While conducting an area check, Officers observed graffiti on a concrete column located in "Lot B." Officers canvassed the area for possible suspects and potential surveillance cameras; however, none were located. The Parks and Public Spaces Department was advised of the location and removed the graffiti.

11-23-2020 Theft 9700 Collins Avenue

A Gucci store associate told officers she left her personal cell phone on a table in the Men's Shoe Department while assisting a customer. The associate returned a short time later and discovered the phone was missing. A review of the store surveillance system revealed a male removed the phone from the table and exited the store. This case has been forwarded to the Criminal Investigations Division for follow-up.

11-24-2020 LPR-Tag Seizure 10200 blk Collins Avenue

An alert from the Village License Plate Reader System (LPRS) alerted officers to a potentially unlicensed driver on the roadways. Officers confirmed the information and initiated a traffic stop. As suspected, the driver had a suspended license and a seize tag order. Officers issued the related citations and seized the tag.
