

Summary of Activities and Events

Code Enforcement

The Code Enforcement Unit continues its assistance to Public Works in ensuring construction sites comply with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) protocols. While on patrol in the gated community, Code Enforcement Officers (CEOs) discovered the NPDES protections on the storm drain in front of a construction site on the 100 Block of Camden Drive was not up to proper standards. CEOs spoke with the contractor and property owner to ensure all deficiencies were immediately corrected.

Code Officers discovered the dumpster at a separate construction site on the 100 Block of Camden Drive overfilled and not properly covered. CEOs issued the property owner a code violation warning and met with the contractor at the scene to ensure the dumpster was promptly emptied.

While patrolling Bal Bay Drive, CEOs discovered a construction site on the 100 Block of Bal Bay Drive was not properly secured. CEOs issued the property owner a code violation warning and also reminded the contractor of the importance of securing the site after hours, ensuring the dumpsters are properly emptied and covered, and securing the decorative lattice hiding the portable bathroom facilities.

Code Officers assisted Patrol Operations by staffing the police dispatcher position due to previously approved leave. CEOs often fill this function to ensure dispatch remain fully operational at all times.

Criminal Investigations

The Criminal Investigations Division (CID) followed-up on a simple battery that occurred at the Le Zoo restaurant. The victim and suspect were known to each other and the victim refused to pursue the case. Detectives positively identified the suspect and cleared the case without further action. The victim was directed to the State Attorney's Office should he change his mind and wish to pursue battery charges against the suspect.

The police academy at Miami-Dade College called upon Detective Hector Gonzalez to provide in-service training to officers from different police agencies in Miami-Dade County. The Autism Awareness training program presented by Detective Gonzalez helps sworn police personnel comply with Florida's mandatory training requirements for law enforcement officers.

03/19/2021

Baker Act

9700 Blk Collins Avenue

While patrolling the Collins Avenue corridor, officers encountered a male who was experiencing a mental crisis. The male requested to be taken to the hospital for treatment and evaluation. The male was voluntarily Baker Acted and transported to the hospital for treatment without incident.

03/19/2021

Assist Citizen

100 Block 96 Street Beach Side

While patrolling the 96st corridor, a Bal Harbour officer located several juveniles exiting the beach past the established curfew time. Once the officers confirmed that no crime had been committed, they transported the juveniles to their home in Bay Harbor Islands.

03/20/2021	Op en Door	9700 Collins Avenue
Officers patrolling the Bal Harbour Shops during the midnight shift discovered an unsecured business. Officers conducted a building search and found no evidence of foul play. The manager responded to the scene and properly secured all doors.		

03/21/2021	Arrest /Battery	9909 Collins Avenue
Officers responded to the second floor of the Sea View Hotel regarding a male and female fighting. The male and female were brother and sister who engaged in a verbal argument which turned physical. The brother was the primary aggressor in the altercation and was placed under arrest. The female victim was treated on scene by Miami-Dade Fire Rescue and released without incident.		

03/21/2021	Dom estic Battery	10245 Collins Avenue
Officers responded to a domestic battery that occurred at the Carlton Terrace. A mother and daughter were involved in an altercation over the daughter’s cellular phone. The mother wanted her daughter to go to bed and took her phone away forcefully. The daughter did not sustain any injuries and it was determined no battery occurred.		

03/23/2021	Baker Act	10275 Collins Avenue
A disturbance at a beach side condominium resulted in police responding to the scene. Upon arriving, officers discovered the suspect apparently suffering from a mental crisis. Officers de-escalated the encounter and transported the suspect to a mental health facility for further evaluation.
